Clean Install? -



Should I upgrade to the newest version of Windows[™] or do a clean install?

Quite often, people opt to do an *upgrade* by installing the new version of WintowsTM on top of their old setup in the hopes that all their personal files and settings will be retained. While the *chances* of this happening are greater in this case; many problems arise in doing so. Many users become victim to "misidentified hardware, unexplained reboots and crashes, and [lack of] hardware and software vendors [support]". The easiest solution is rarely the best.

The recommended method of *upgrading* to a new version is a *clean install*. This means backing up all user data and personal settings (careful: they're hidden throughout the hard drive), wiping the hard drive clean, and installing the full version of WindowsTM to the empty drive. Once all the devices have been detected and their drivers installed; programs can be reinstalled using their original media, data can be restored from backup, and personal settings brought back either from backup or by recreating them manually.

The *clean install* method might seem arduous, but it is well worth it in the long run. Your system will have more disk space, a clean registry, and no misbehaving devices.
